




Enrollment by Segment




Student Attendance in Fall 2016




Graduate Enrollment



Enrollment by Gender




Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity






Degrees by Race






Retention, Graduation, and Transfer

Retention and Graduation at Four-Year Public Institutions




4-Year Community College Retention and Graduation Rates, Entering Class of 2012




Average Tuition and Fees for Resident Undergraduates (2017-2018)


Average Tuition and Fees for Resident Undergraduates
