The Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC) met on Wednesday, January 22, 2020 via conference call.

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by **Chairman Hasan** at approximately 1:01 p.m. All members of the Commission were present.

Approval of Minutes – Action Item

There was a motion by **Commissioner MacFarlane** and a second by **Commissioner Jackson** for approval of the December 4, 2019 meeting minutes. The motion was approved unanimously.

Chairman's Remarks

Chairman Hasan mentioned Commissioner Rizwan Siddiqi's recent resignation and informed everyone that Secretary Fielder was currently working with the Governor's Appointments Office to fill empty seats on the Commission.

Chairman Hasan mentioned some statistics he saw from the National Center for Education Statistics regarding the significant number of Maryland students who leave the state to attend college elsewhere. He would like to continue the conversation on this subject matter in the future and discuss how to retain Maryland students.

Secretary's Remarks

Chairman Hasan recognized Secretary Fielder who introduced Mr. Christopher Madaio, Assistant Attorney General in the Office of the Attorney General. Mr. Madaio works in the Consumer Protection Division and is on the phone to answer any questions about one of the items on the agenda. Secretary Fielder also remarked that MHEC staff will look into the statistics mentioned by Chairman Hasan. He further reported that Mr. Geoffrey Newman, Assistant Secretary of Higher Education, was currently overseeing the filling of several vacancies in the agency. Additionally, as the legislative session has recently commenced, MHEC staff are currently preparing for various hearings. Chairman Hasan offered to attend and provide testimony, if needed.

Commissioner Committee Updates

Chairman Hasan remarked that updates will be tabled to the next meeting. He mentioned that Commissioner Jackson will lead the Outreach, Grants, and Financial Assistance Committee, and he recognized Commissioner MacFarlane of the Finance and Operations Committee who asked that a replacement be found for Commissioner Siddiqi who resigned recently. Chairman Hasan recognized Secretary Fielder who reported that he was working with the Governor's Appointments Office to seek new Commissioners. Chairman Hasan also recognized Commissioner Yaeger who informed everyone that Commissioner Barrolle was now a member of the Program Review Committee.

<u>Department of Finance and Administration – Final Approval of New COMAR Program</u> Regulations – Workforce Readiness Grant – Action Item

Chairman Hasan recognized Mr. Newman who reported that the Maryland Higher Education Commission approved on September 25, 2019 for publication in the Maryland Register the proposed new program regulations for the Workforce Readiness Grant (created by Senate Bill 515, enacted as Ch. 457 of the Acts of 2019). The regulations were published in the Maryland Register on November 22, 2019. The public comment period for the regulations ended on December 23, 2019, and no public comments were received. The proposed regulations are ready for the Commission's final adoption.

Mr. Newman recommended that the Commission approves for final adoption the proposed regulations for the Workforce Readiness Grant, which were published in the Maryland Register on November 22, 2019. **Commissioner Mitchell** made a motion for approval and **Commissioner Barrolle** seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

<u>Department of Academic Affairs – Approval to Publish Proposed COMAR Regulations – Changes to Associate of Arts in Teaching (A.A.T.) – Action Item</u>

Chairman Hasan recognized Dr. Emily Dow, Assistant Secretary for Academic Affairs, who reported that the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) recently shared a policy change approved by the Maryland State Board of Education to accept a 3.0 Grade Point Average (GPA) in lieu of a passing score on an approved basic skills assessment when applying for a Maryland Educator Certificate. COMAR identifies a specific associate's degree, the Associate of Arts in Teaching (A.A.T.), for students at community colleges interested in becoming

teachers. In light of the recent policy change at MSDE, regulatory changes for the A.A.T. need to be made to align with this policy change. These changes were requested by the A.A.T. statewide oversight committee and presented to the MHEC Segmental Advisory Council for review, circulation, and feedback. No further changes were requested by the Segmental Advisory Council. The proposed COMAR regulations are for the purpose of aligning MHEC standards for the A.A.T. with the policy change implemented at MSDE.

Dr. Dow recommended that the Commission approve for publication in the Maryland Register the proposed regulations for regarding the Associate of Arts in Teaching, and authorize MHEC's attorneys to approve non-substantive revisions as necessary to conform the proposed regulations to the stylistic and formatting requirements of AELR and of the Division of State Documents. **Commissioner Boyd** made a motion for approval and **Commissioner Jimenez** seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

<u>Department of Academic Affairs – Final Approval of New COMAR Regulations – Private Inurement by Nonprofit Institutions of Higher Education – Action Item</u>

Chairman Hasan recognized Dr. Dow who reported that the Commission approved for publication on September 25, 2019 in the Maryland Register the proposed regulations regarding "private inurement" by nonprofit institutions of higher education.

These regulations are required by House Bill 461 from the 2019 legislative session, which was a response to for-profit institutions that have reorganized as nonprofit institutions while engaging in transactions that primarily benefit private interests instead of the institution's educational interests. Under the regulations, an institution must submit an annual report with information regarding their nonprofit status and certain transactions that may constitute private inurement. Upon receipt of the report, the Secretary will issue findings regarding these transactions. Institutions found to have engaged in private inurement will be able to participate in a corrective action process. If, after this process, the Secretary finds that the private inurement has not been remedied, MHEC will classify it as a for-profit institution. This classification allows MHEC to take certain actions to protect students, such as requiring an institution to provide a financial guarantee.

The regulations were published in the Maryland Register on November 22, 2019. The public comment period for the regulations ended on December 23, 2019. During this period, MHEC received five comments, all strongly in support of the adoption of these regulations. The proposed regulations are ready for the Commission's final adoption, with a minor non-substantive change to the text of Regulation .02B(9)(c) to clarify the language, as reflected in tracked changes in the copy of the regulations.

Dr. Dow recommended that the Commission approves for final adoption the proposed regulations, including the non-substantive change reflected in the text, regarding "private inurement" by nonprofit institutions of higher education, which were published in the Maryland Register on November 22, 2019. **Commissioner Yaeger** made a motion for approval and **Commissioner Barrolle** seconded the motion. Clarifying questions were asked about the regulations. The motion was approved unanimously.

SUBJECT: FY 2022 Community College Construction Grant Program: State and Local Cost-

Sharing Formula

The Community College Construction Grant Program provides State assistance for the construction and improvement of facilities at community colleges. This grant funds the construction of major new facilities, renovation of existing facilities, and improvements to campus infrastructure.

The level of State participation in capital projects for the community colleges is determined by two criteria: the portion of the project that meets the space eligibility requirements for State support, and the State and local cost-sharing formula prescribed in statute and calculated by the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE). MSDE uses this cost-sharing formula to calculate the State's share in providing financial assistance for public education. The formula is based on a current expense calculation that considers the enrollment of students in elementary and secondary schools and county wealth (e.g. net taxable income, the assessed valuation of real property, and the assessed value of personal property).

Based on this cost-sharing formula, the State contributes between 50 percent and 70 percent of the eligible costs of a project for single-county-operated community colleges and 75 percent of the eligible costs of a project for regional community colleges. The table on the next page shows the percentage of State share for newly introduced projects in the FY 2022 community college capital budget request.

I. PROGRAM OBJECTIONS - 1

Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 13B.02.03.27B requires the Commission to circulate program proposals for thirty days for comment or objections from in-state institutions.

The Secretary or an institution may file an objection to implementation of a proposed program if the objection is based on:

- a. Inconsistency of the proposed program with the institution's approved mission;
- b. Not meeting a regional or Statewide need consistent with the State Plan;
- c. Unreasonable program duplication which would cause demonstrable harm to another institution; or
- d. Violation of the State's equal educational opportunity obligations under State and federal law.

What follows is a summary of all in-state objections the Commission has received between October 1, 2019 and December 31, 2019 to program proposals submitted for review. If a decision has been made within the same time frame or at the time of this report, it is provided below.

SUBJECT: Proposed COMAR Changes to Add New Definition: First-time with Advanced

Standing

A new definition is needed for high school students who have earned college credit while in high school. The proposed regulatory changes provide a new definition, "first-time student with advanced standing," and includes edits that are inclusive of this burgeoning population.

Dual enrollment opportunities (i.e., the opportunity to take college coursework while enrolled in high school) have increased significantly over the past several years. Subsequently, many students are graduating high school with college credit. Under current Maryland regulations, these recent high school graduates with college credit are technically considered "transfer students" when they enroll for the first time after graduating high school. By considering these recent high school graduates as transfer students, they are often awarded the benefits of transfer students, such as the ability to transfer their college credits earned while in high school. However, the benefits of being a "first-time student" may not be provided when a student is considered a transfer student, and advantages such as specific freshman scholarships, access to specific freshman housing, orientation, and other opportunities to ensure student success may be denied.

For these reasons, a new definition is needed to characterize "first-time" students who transfer college credit earned while in high school. Institutions will be able to use this new definition to maximize all opportunities, both as a first-time student and as a student who is transferring college credit that was earned while in high school.

In addition to the proposed new definitions, the proposed changes include revisions that are inclusive to students with advanced standing.

The proposed changes have been discussed at length with the Student Transfer Advisory Council and circulated to various stakeholders. There has been general endorsement of the proposed changes.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Commission approve for publication in the Maryland Register the enclosed regulations regarding the addition of new definitions and relevant changes, and authorize MHEC's attorneys to approve non-substantive revisions as necessary to conform the proposed regulations to the stylistic and formatting requirements of AELR and of the Division of State Documents.
