Dear Executive Director:

As you may be aware, on March 5, 2020, Governor Larry Hogan declared a state of emergency pertaining to the Coronavirus/COVID-19 to ramp up Maryland's coordinated response across all levels of government¹. Many of our Maryland higher education campuses are actively moving academic learning to an online format for the near future. We recently notified institutions that no approval is required from the Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC) at this time to move lectures, discussions, assessments, and other academic coursework to an online format.

Regarding programs that lead to licensure, the US Department of Education has left the decision to accept clock-hours in a distance education format up to the applicable licensure body². **To best support students through this transition, we are asking that you provide guidance regarding your licensing board's acceptance or denial of a change in modality (e.g., face-to-face or distance education) for clock-hours that are required for licensure or certification.** Please provide this guidance (or a timeline for the guidance) by close of business Friday, March 13, 2020.
