## **Background**

The Campus-Based Educational Assistance Grant (CBEAG) is a component of the State's larger Educational Excellence Awards (EEA) program and is designed to assist needy students who, due to extenuating circumstances, may have missed financial aid deadlines. These students could be first-generation college students, students from low-income families, older students with need who are returning to college, or students lacking family support structures.

The concept of a campus-based financial assistance program was discussed by the Task Force to Study College Readiness for Disadvantaged and Capable Students. The Task Force heard numerous reports from higher education advocates that the current method for awarding the Educational Assistance Grant (EAG), another component of the EEA program, had rigid deadlines and did not meet the needs of low-income students who may decide late in the year to attend school. Listed in the Task Force's final report is a recommendation to decentralize a portion of the State's need-based aid programs, allowing Maryland institutions to better assist these students and more effectively package their State aid. Under this recommendation, institutions can award financial aid throughout the year to needy students who have applied later during the year.

In 2002, the General Assembly passed legislation entitled the College Readiness for Disadvantaged and Capable Students Act of 2002, which was put forth by the Task Force. This legislation established the CBEAG and required the Maryland Higher Education Commission to adopt guidelines for Maryland institutions of higher education to award students who meet the requirements for receiving State need-based aid but have missed the March 1 deadline due to extenuating circumstances.

### **Program Overview, Funding, and Awarding**

The Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC) approved the CBEAG guidelines and implemented the program in FY 2004, or academic year 2003-2004. This component of the EEA program is decentralized, which allows the institution's financial aid counselors to award students directly that apply late for admission. The goal is to provide assistance to needy students who missed the State's deadline of March 1, and in turn advise them of Maryland's deadline for applying for need-based aid for the following academic year. A student receiving a CBEAG who meets the March 1 deadline for the following academic year will then be incorporated into the State's largest need-based program, the EAG. To be awarded in the CBEAG program, students must be Maryland residents and be eligible for a Federal Pell Grant. Recipients must be full-time students and accepted for admission in a regular undergraduate program leading to a degree or a diploma at an eligible institution. Students must also demonstrate financial need as determined by the Office of Student Financial Assistance.

In FY 2004, using carry forward funds, MHEC allocated \$2 million to Maryland's higher education institutions to be awarded to students. An increase in need-based aid funding in FY 2005 provided for the \$2 million to be incorporated into MHEC's base

budget. In FY 2006, additional funding increased the allocation to Maryland's higher education institutions to \$3 million.

MHEC allocates the funds to institutions of higher education in Maryland based on the proportion of full-time Pell recipients enrolled at each institution. The institutions are required to submit three reports throughout the year. Two reports are submitted with a list of recipients for the CBEAG during the academic year and one final end-of-year report detailing specific information about the students awarded, including: 1) what year in school students received the award; 2) income data; 3) age; 4) gender; 5) dependent or independent status; and 6) the number of students who received the award that are registered, transferring, or are graduating.

Award amounts are based on a percentage of the student's unmet need. Need is calculated by taking the MHEC institutional cost of attendance and subtracting the estimated family contribution, estimated Pell Grant, and certain other State awards the student is receiving. The CBEAG awards 35% of the remaining amount of unmet need if the student is attending a four-year public institution or independent institution, and awards 45% of the remaining amount of need to students attending Maryland community colleges.

An institution may not award a CBEAG to a recipient of a Guaranteed Access or an EAG offered by the Office of Student Financial Assistance. Students may hold other State scholarships or grants but must meet all conditions for all awards and may not receive an amount combined from all State programs that exceeds the maximum amount established in OSFA's General Policies.

### **Analysis**

The following tables compare data from FY 2004 and FY 2005 and depict the demographic data of the CBEAG recipients. Table 1 shows the total number of students that received a CBEAG in FY 2004 and FY 2005 and subsequently submitted a FAFSA by the March 1 deadline to be awarded as a traditional EAG recipient for the following academic year. Table 2 shows each segment of higher education's allocation and their total number of recipients for FY 2004 and FY 2005. The overall number of recipients for the CBEAG has remained relatively constant over the past two years and at least 60% of the recipients attended a community college in each year.

Table 3 shows the total number and percent of recipients by year in school the award was received. The majority of students in all four segments of higher education are freshman students, 45% in FY 2004 and 44% in FY 2005. Table 4 illustrates income range for the CBEAG recipients. Almost 60% of recipients have family incomes of less than \$20,000 a year. Table 5 indicates that at least 40% of the recipients in FY 2004 and FY 2005 were 26 years of age or older. As illustrated in Table 6, females comprise the greatest share of recipients of the CBEAG, with 68% of recipients being female in FY 2004 and 65% in FY 2005. Independent students encompass the majority of the recipients as shown in Table 7, with 68% of the recipients in FY 2004 and 63% in FY 2005.

### **Conclusion**

After reviewing the data, the majority of recipients for the CBEAG are females, 26 years of age or older who are independent, making less than \$20,000 per year, and attending a community college as a freshman student. Almost 500 recipients that are in the traditional college age range (18 to 21) were supported by a grant. Given that 91% of the recipients had family incomes of less than \$40,000, MHEC concludes that the CBEAG is assisting a needy student population who may not otherwise be able to attend college. Students are very low-income and most likely have extenuating circumstances that have precluded them from being aware of financial aid deadlines and attending school as traditional students. Further information is needed to understand why the majority of CBEAG recipients are females returning to college at ages 26 or older and why such a small percentage are receiving traditional EAGs the following year. One can speculate that many recipients are single mothers who may not be able to attend college as full-time students from one year to the next. However, the CBEAG is making strides in awarding applicants that, for extenuating circumstances, have missed the State's March 1 deadline for applying for need-based aid. As financial aid directors become more familiar with the CBEAG, the program will continue to meet the needs of students in achieving their educational goals.
