## BACKGROUND

The Private Donation Incentive Program (PDI P) provides State-m atching funds to prom ote private fundraising within Maryla nd's public colleges and univers ities and also to encourage public institutions of higher educ ation to increase the public's level of gifts and do nations to the institution's endowm ents. First created by the General Assem bly in 1990 for a seven-year period, the State provided m atching funds for donations m ade to the endowm ents of public institutions and their affilia ted foundations. By the end of the seven-year program , the endowments of these institutions increased \$47 million; \$34 million of which came from private donations and \$13 m illion from State m atching funds . Prior to th e establishment of this program, most comm unity co lleges did no t h ave foundations, endo wment acco unts, or an organized approach to fundrai sing. Several comm unity colle ges credit this program with enabling them to estab lish endowm ent accounts and providing them with an o pportunity to develop fund raising procedures.

In 1999, the General Assem bly reauthorized the program for an additional six-year period for eligible institutions. The grant period began in fiscal 1999 and with the exception of the State's historically black institutions all donation payments were to be made by June 30, 2004. Since its reauthorization, the General Assem bly has made several modifications to this program. As part of the im plementation of the State's agreem ent with the U.S. Departm ent of Education, Office for Civil Rights, General Assem bly extended the eligibility period for Maryland's historically black institutions (to January 2010) and increas ed the maximum payments to \$1.5 m illion. In addition, the General Assembly passed legislation that increased to \$1.25 million, the maximum State match for eligible donations made to the University of Ma ryland, Baltimore County. This increase was a resu It of a change in Carnegie classification for the University of Marylan d, Baltimore County.

### **ELIGIBLE DONATIONS**

The State will match only donations designated as endowment gifts. In addition, donations must be made and used solely for acad emic purposes consistent with the role and mission of the institution as approved by the Maryland Higher Education Commission. Under this program, fiscal 1998 is the base year against which all futu re contributions are compared for eligibility for the State match. New donor contributions are eligible in full a nd for repeat donors; the eligible contribution is that portion of the donation that is the increase over the donation given in the base year.

PDIP provides the following State matching ratio for dollars raised by the comm unity colleges and the State's tradition ally white institutions and/or their foundations (State funds: Donation funds):

1:1	First \$250,000, or any portion thereof;
1:2	Next \$1,000,000, or any portion thereof; and
1:3	Next \$1,250,000.

For donations m ade at Maryland's historically black institutions after July 1, 2001 (i.e., fiscal 2002), the State provides a 2:1 m atch for the first \$250,000 and a 1:1 m atch for the next \$1

million. Table 1 below shows the maxim um State funds allowed over the course of the program for Maryland's public colleges and universities.

### **CURRENT STATUS OF THE PROGRAM**

Between fiscal 1999 and fiscal 2008, Maryland's public colleges and universities reported \$46.8 million from private d onors and claimed over \$18.9 m illion in elig ible State m atching funds. Over this p eriod, Maryland's four h istorically black institutions received over \$5.3 million in State m atching funds for the PDIP. The fiscal 2010 appropriation includes \$145,909 in State matching funds, meeting the statutory obligation for Bowie State University (Table II).

Overall, institutions contend that the PDIP has had as ignificant impact in attracting donors, providing scholarship f unds, and building capacity to ensure the continuation of successful campus academic programs. The program has expired for all institutions except the HBI's; with all other public two and four-year colleges and unive rsities having met t he maximum S tate match. From the program s' inception in 1999 th rough fiscal 2008, community colleges raised over \$8.3 m illion; the research in stitutions (University of Maryland, Baltim ore, University of Maryland, Baltim ore County, and University of Maryland, Colleg e Park) rais ed over \$1 8.6 million, while the other traditionally white institutions raised \$11.6 million.

PDIP has also been an important fundrais ing tool for Maryland's histo rically black institutions. Through fiscal 2008, the HBIs rais ed over \$8.1 million, of which \$5.4 m illion is eligible for matching State funds. Coppin State University, Mo rgan State University, and University of Maryland Eastern Shore have met the maximum State match. Bowie State University has until fiscal 2010 to meet the maximum participation level.
