Temporary Statewide Agreement for Associate of Arts in Teaching Candidates in Light of the COVID-19 Pandemic

The COVID-19 pandemic has severely and significantly limited a student's ability to sit for nationally standardized tests offered at testing facilities. This includes the SAT, ACT, GRE, and Praxis. At this time, many testing centers are either closed or are providing very limited testing appointments and are prioritizing testing services for health professions.

In order to earn an Associate of Arts in Teaching (AAT) degree in Maryland, a student must provide evidence of qualifying scores, established by the State Superintendent of Schools, on the teacher certification tests approved by the State Board of Education (COMAR 13B.02.03.24(D)2¹). Students on track to graduate in May 2020 or Summer 2020, may not be eligible to earn the AAT because they cannot take the requisite teacher certification tests due to the closure or limited operations of testing centers.

To assist AAT students in this predicament, the following statewide agreement is presented.

The teacher education departments and programs at the 4-year colleges and universities identified below have agreed to defer the requirement for AAT students to pass Praxis I, if the students have met all the other requirements for admission, and all requirements for an AAT degree, as established by the State Superintendent of Schools and the State Board of Education. Students who have been admitted to a teacher education program at a four-year university or college should follow the guidance below.

- AAT students who take advantage of this opportunity are expected to meet the testing
 requirement for the AAT as soon reasonably practicable once testing centers are
 providing the applicable test to the general public. An AAT student is expected to report
 testing scores to their community college as soon as possible so that the AAT degree can
 be awarded.
- The education department chairs at the community colleges identified below commit to
 providing an AAT student an affirmation letter indicating that the student has completed
 all AAT requirements with the exception of the required examination of basic skills.
 This affirmation letter must be presented by the student to the 4-year institution upon
 transfer.

This statewide agreement remains in effect until November 1, 2020. On or before, November 1, 2020, an evaluation of the continued need of this statewide agreement will be conducted by the Maryland Higher Education Commission.
